


# Green Mountain Sugar House

Green Mountain Sugar House is a quality Vermont family business built in 1967 by David and Marjorie Harlow. It was sold in 1985 from Marjorie and David Harlow to their daughter Ann Rose and her husband Doug Rose, the current owners. The sugar house does everything from tapping trees to collecting sap, to boiling and freshly packing the syrup. Along with making maple specialties such as maple cream, candy and nut brittle.

The Sugar House is a Vermont tourist and historical staple located along Route 100 North, along the shores of Lake Pauline. Syrup is made with years of experience and a pledge to use only the most tried and true of the new technologies to make the award winning flavor that is our heritage.

The funds will be used to build a new remote sap and pump house, which is critical to the further development of their maple sugaring business.
